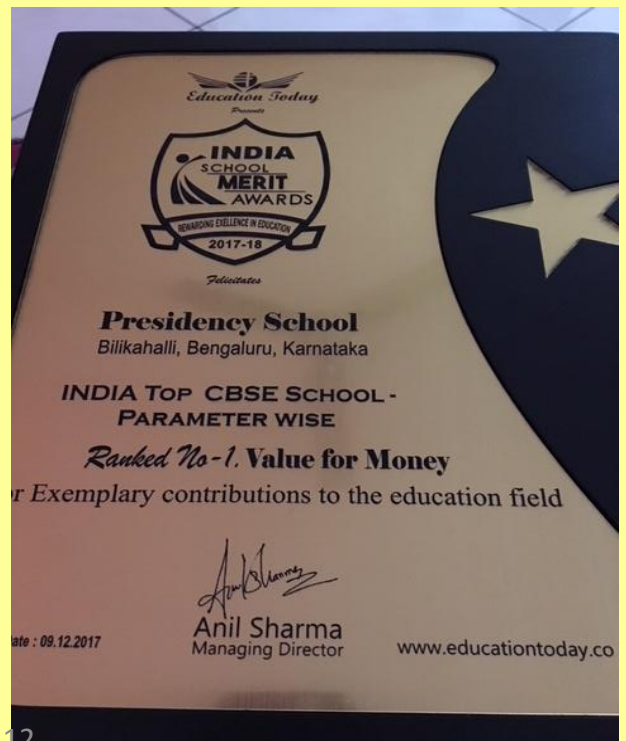

methodologies for every level. In the academic year of 2017-2018, the school has been conferred two awards viz. Value for Money and Individual Attention to students by the Education To-day. "Parents hand over their children to us with utmost trust, in the hope of seeing them acquire wholesome education. Comprehending this, we accord equal emphasis on class activities and outdoor activities," shares Bhuvaneshwari.

The campus of PSBS is spread over two acres of land, situated off Bannerghatta Road with an aesthetic looking building that is loaded with state-of-the-art facilities. Spacious digital classrooms, well-equipped laboratories, audio-video studios, playground, library and so on are some of the facilities. The management of the school takes safety as the highest priority, given which round-the-clock security supervision is enforced

A Zion where people didn't fight over the languages they spoke or the states they belonged to, for there was neither language nor region to separate, just gestures of benevolence, with the Sun shining over the mountains and deserts with the same grace. 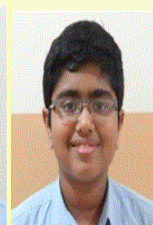

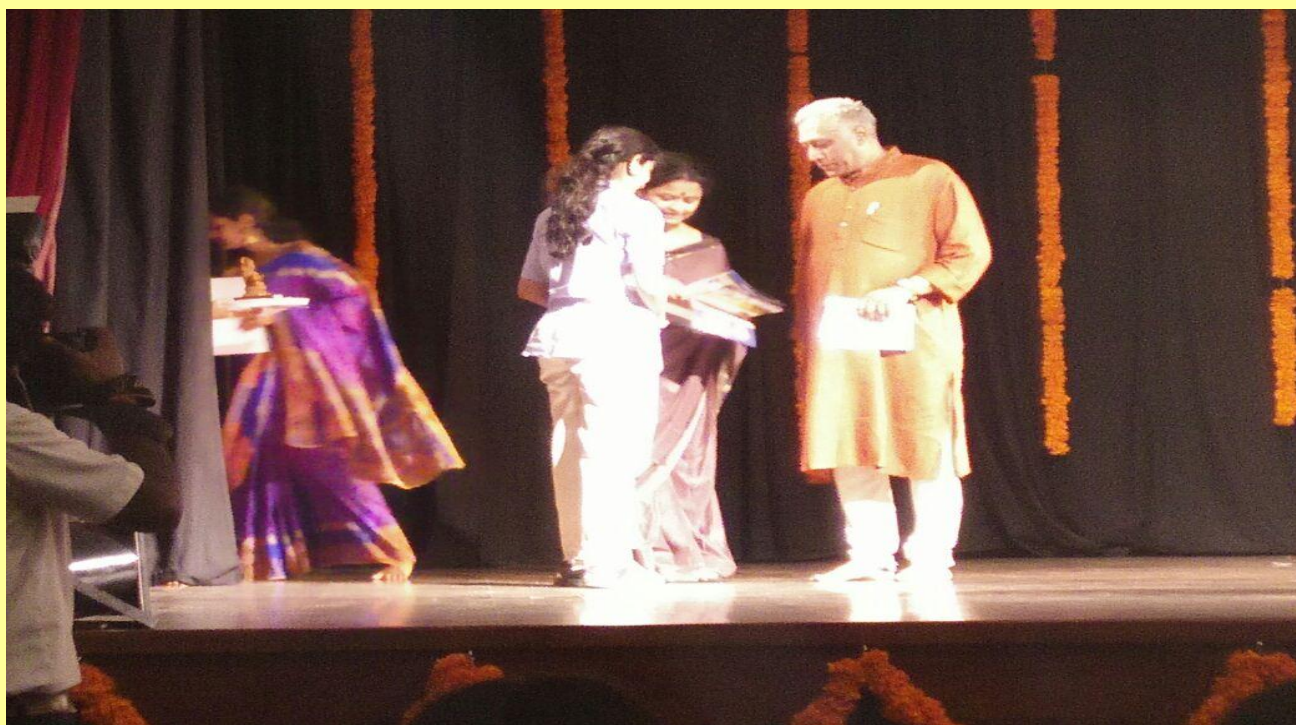

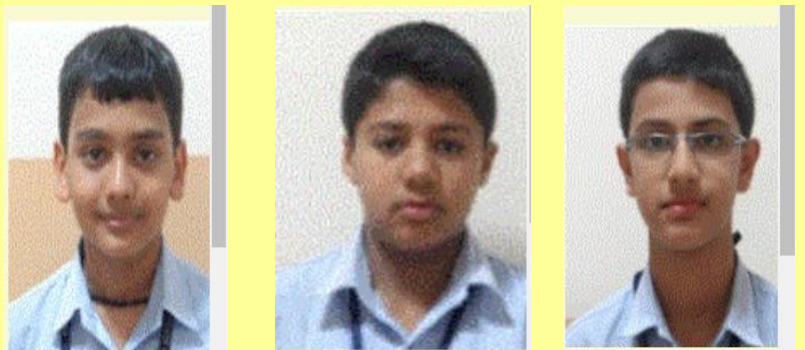
